This online course will explore the nature and extent of crime and justice systems in the Caribbean. The current issues and concerns that officials are facing related to crime and criminals, as well as the challenges of the administration of justice in both emerging democracies and in struggling economies will be considered. Through the development of projects and the sharing of information, you will learn about the variety of systems of justice in the Caribbean basin.



Location and Itinerary

The group will travel to Barbados over spring break, March 13-19, 2005, where we will visit police units, courts and correctional facilities. The group will tour the countryside so that the justice system can be put in context. We will speak with justice professionals at all levels.



Admission Requirements

Florida students from any State University System institution or out-of-state students who have a minimum 2.0 GPA may apply. Students from other universities and community colleges are also encouraged to apply. Evidence of good health, emotional stability, maturity, and adaptability must be submitted. Criminal justice professionals may either audit the course or take it for credit.

Costs

The cost for this program is approximately \$800, which includes guest lectures, accommodation, emergency medical insurance and all local excursions. The cost **does not** cover meals, airfare, UCF tuition, independent travel or personal expenses.

Housing

Students share accommodations in a hotel in the St. Lawrence Gap area.

Financial Aid and Scholarships

Students may apply university financial aid toward program costs. Applicants for loans, grants, or other need-based scholarships must submit a current

Free Application for Federal Student Assistance (FAFSA) well before the program date to the Office of Student Financial Assistance. Further information is available at the Office of Financial Assistance, located in 120 Millican Hall (407-823-2827).

A limited number of study abroad scholarships are also available. Scholarships are awarded both according to need (as documented on the FAFSA) and based on enrollment in the UCF Burnett Honors College. The student must be accepted for the program and pay the deposit in order to be considered for these awards.

Transportation

A group flight will be available for those who wish to travel together. Students interested should contact the Program Director. UCF cannot be held responsible for changes in travel plans once they are made. Travel insurance to absorb costs of unused airline tickets and other expenses is highly recommended.
